Understanding Climate Change

With an average surface temperature increase of **1.2C** since preindustrial levels and predictions of an increase beyond this, the time to act on climate change is now.

Climate change is caused by Global Warming but don't let 'warming' fool you – as surface temperatures continue to rise, the UK will see wetter winters, drier summers and more extreme weather events. This includes floods, droughts and wildfires.

Both the hottest and wettest years since records began have been within the last 10 years.

The biodiversity crisis refers to the rapid decline of species and ecosystems worldwide, threatening the delicate balance of life on Earth.

By 2025 millennials and Gen Z will make up more than 75% of the workforce.

A 2016 study by Cone Communications found that 76% of millennials consider a companies social and environmental commitments and nearly two thirds won't take a job if a potential employer doesn't have strong CSR practices.

The same study found that Gen Z is the generation most likely to believe that companies should address urgent and social environmental issues with a whopping 94% of those surveyed saying so.

Indications suggest that extreme weather is likely to cost the UK billions of pounds and will wipe at least 1% off GDP growth every year by 2045.

Action on Climate Change will leave businesses more resilient to change and commitments to sustainability will attract and retain a quality workforce.

A space for wildlife

Did you know the whole layout of Quorum Park was redesigned to incorporate our letch area, found to be home of water voles?

From its inception to the park has been created with designated strips of natural habitat, such as green spaces, native vegetation, or water bodies, created to connect isolated patches of wildlife-friendly areas.

These allow animals to move freely, promoting biodiversity and mitigating the negative impacts of our development on local wildlife.

We're pleased to report the wildlife corridors remain thriving wildlife hot spots in the last 12 months alone we've had regular visits from a family of deer, a barn owl sighting and bats. Keen to give nature a helping hand, our wildlife group have been hard at work creating and supporting wildlife habitats with the introduction of a variety of habitats.

Don't mind the weeds, we're feeding the bees

Summer used to bring with it the scent of fresh cut grass, but thanks to initiatives such as No Mow May, which encourages wildflower growth and nectar for our bees, the season is now punctuated by a different sensory experience – the buzzing of insects and vibrant bursts of colour. This is certainly the case at Quorum Park, where we're proud to be part of the rewilding revolution!

Increased biodiversity is directly linked to tackling climate change. Often, softer, more ecologically focused elements of sustainability such as these are written off as 'the fluffy stuff', but it needs to be an integral part of the planet's recovery.

On top of our rewilded spaces we've also created cultivated pollinator paradises at the entrance to the park with more year round bee friendly planting including echinacea, lavender, rudbeckia and crocosmia.

Our stumpery and wildlife pond were introduced in an attempt to introduce an areas we could leave wood and cuttings to rot and decompose, creating a great habitat for caterpillars and other creepy crawlies as moss and lichen thrive in the shady corners. Caterpillar friendly spaces this year = next year's butterflies!



Our top rewilding tips!

Just let it Grow!

Some of our most successful patches of rewilded land were simply created by leaving grass to grow long. With so much existing planting in and around site, flowers quickly self seeded and nature took it's course. Free, easy and great for planet earth!

Enjoy the results

The importance of connecting with nature can't be understated. It is important to us that we create opportunities for staff to connect and engage with what we'd done.

For us, that included increasing seating areas in the rewilded spaces, information signage and a guided walk.

Pockets of pollinato

If your budget doesn't stretch to planting out a whole area, get creative with mini pockets of wildflower planting and let them self seed into bigger spaces over time.

A mix of perennials, annuals and biennials should see you through the whole year. Foxgloves, Poppies, lvy and ragwort and mallow being examples of planting that has thrived here at Quorum.

Save those seed

Once flowers are finished flowering, cut back to the ground in September and help seeds along by drying and collecting them, scatter in the desired space or share with friends. Our onsite seed swap is situated at Quorum Allotment.

A note on the bees...

Quorum Park introduced beehives to site over 10 years ago aand we were proud to offer our occupiers honey.

In truth, honey beehives are not the answer to improving pollinator spaces and can in fact have a negative impact on local eco systems competing for pollen.

With the hives established and the local honey incredibly popular with staff we've committed to a gradual reduction of hives onsite and increased introduction of local native pollinator planting onsite.

A quick glance at our cornflowers will reveal a whole plethora of pollinator species enjoying the landscape.

Resource Use & Supply Chain

At Quorum Park, we understand that our resource use has a significant impact on the environment, economy, and society as a whole both through our direct emissions produced onsite and the footprint of our supply chain.

Our main aim has been to maintain a careful balance between the comfort of tenants onsite and managing our environmental commitments to reduce our presence.

Procurement has a significant role in the reduction of waste and forms a key part of any sustainability strategy.

As we strive to support our tenants on their journey to Net Zero, we understand that renewable energy will play a big part in our future.

As well as an exciting partnership with green energy market, Urban Chain we are working on ambitious renewable energy projects.

Urban Chain Renewable Energy

For many years, Quorum Park has been proud to supply REGO backed, 100% renewable energy to the buildings under our control and shared communal spaces.

From late 2023, we're going one step further and have agreed to an innovative new power purchase deal as we look to fully convert to greener energy sources across site.

Peer-to-peer energy exchange is a relatively new form of power provision in the UK, allowing individuals and companies to sell electricity to others directly.

Quorum Park will be able to secure electricity from 100% renewable sources and use advanced Al technology to report exactly what source our renewable energy comes from while prioritising locally produced renewable solutions, in turn helping boost the local economy by supporting localised energy solutions.

It's a win win for tenants as green, localised energy results in lower energy bills with better ESG credentials and reporting capabilities!

It is Quorum Park's vision to integrate Urban Chain into the wider community by encouraging tenants of privately owned buildings to join us on this journey and Urban Chain will be supporting us as we look to invest in renewable energy solutions generated right here on the park.





Active Travel

Transport currently accounts for approximately 30% of the UK's carbon emissions.

By promoting walking, cycling, and the use of public transportation, we aim to enhance the well-being of our occupants, reduce carbon emissions, alleviate traffic congestion, and foster a sustainable and vibrant community. Embracing active travel not only benefits individuals but also contributes to our collective efforts in building a greener and more resilient future.

Here at Quorum Park we consider ourselves an exemplar standard of active travel promotion with over a decade of promoting green transport options to our onsite tenants, but know that this still remains one of the most contentious and emotive areas of conversation around individual behavioural change and action.

There is no one size fits all approach to active travel, instead we aim to provide a plethora of options with flexibility and realistic options for the workplace.

Post Covid-19 working patterns have been transformed and expectations shifted-is this a key moment to see real change?

Quorum Express Zone

The Quorum Express zone was born as a result of a cultural shift across the UK. Covid -19 changed working practices forever and we began to look at ways to adapt to hybrid working and challenging times for public transport.

A core thread of our strategy involves supporting the modal shift away from single occupancy car journeys with the best amenities possible.

In May 2023 we introduced the Quorum Express travel zone between local metro station, Four Lane Ends and Quorum Park. This replaced our shuttle bus service which had previously only operated in peak times Monday–Friday. Previously passengers were offered discount for travel passes but single journeys were still £1 a time.

We realised that funding individual journeys for staff commuting to the park would be cheaper than running the shuttle bus route. With the added benefit that instead of solely operating at peak times, we're able to offer this service seven days a week, all day long.

We partnered with local bus

providers and developed a free travel zone between Four Lane Ends Interchange and the park, the Q Express pass is housed within the Quorum App and is valid on any of the bus routes which service the park with an average frequency of every 25 minutes but can be up to every 15 minutes in busier windows.

Now, passengers simply get on any of the buses leaving four lane ends, display their Q Express Pass and pop on local bus services free of charge. David Parker, Commercial Manager at local bus provider, Stagecoach is thrilled with the move. "The 'Final Mile' is often a challenge in modal shift, it's often a deciding factor in people's transport choices. People are looking for quick and convenient means to get where they need to be - not a mile up the road! The Q Express pass helps connect Quorum staff with a whole range of transport choices at Four Lane Ends Interchange at no extra cost to the individual".

This has proven an economical option for the park, with individual journeys totalling less than the cost of the shuttle bus running, All of this with the added bonus of continued and regular traffic to our App. A great example of adapting to new working patterns.





Did you know Quorum Park was shortlisted for Cycle Friendly workplace of the year?

Supporting our cycling community has always been a huge priority for us, we look to help interested staff get started on their cycling journey and continue to support regular cyclists too.

Not only do our buildings come complete with bike storage, showers and changing facilities as standard, we have all the cycle support you could need from our onsite cycle hub support network.

The Quorum Bicycle User Group is pitched at everyone, whether you're a total beginner or a lycra clad pro, we've got something for you!

We've invested heavily in a top class fleet of pool bikes, including 6 eBikes, all complete with pannier, lock and helmet. If you need extra confidence to build up to rides we can offer route advice, training rides and one to one buddy support.

Here at Quorum we benefit from the local Waggon Ways system so are surrounded by enjoyable offroad routes connecting cyclists in every direction. We encourage staff to get to know the Waggon Ways with regular group rides. This varies from local family friendly trips at weekends and in the school holidays to more challenging rides like our 100km Northumberland challenge.

Whatever your motivation for making the move to two wheels, we can support you – second hand bike sales, discounts at local stores and regular bike lock and equipment sales make Quorum Bicycle User Group the one stop shop for cyclists on the park.

Get Pedalling!

Hire one of our fleet of pool bikes – we've got standard, electric and folding bikes in a range of sizes. Sign up to one of our regular Biker's Breakfasts and Dr Bike events for a free bike check with a breakfast sarnie thrown in for good measure!

Not sure where is the safest route? Our bike buddy system can connect you with other riders on the route or we can draw you out the safest route.

Awareness & Community

Building a strong sense of community is vital for fostering relationships and creating a supportive environment within Quorum Park.

The People and Culture forum is an in-person monthly learning and networking event for people who are passionate about employee satisfaction and productivity, and are interested in the science and psychology behind having an engaged and productive workforce.

Quorum Park is proud to be home to the People & Culture Forum since 2021 with sessions ran from the Q11 building on the second Wednesday of each month. Sessions are ran Becca Brighty of Brighty people, a firm helping businesses and employees to unlock long-term workplace happiness and success.

The forum has been going from strength to strength, helping members of the Quorum Park community to become more resilient and confident. Past topics have included imposter syndrome, the psychological contract, building resilience and mental wellbeing throughout a career.

One session 'An introduction to neurodiversity and individual differences in the workplace', was designed to educate delegates about what neurodiversity means, highlight that we're all different, and foster an understanding of the impacts that different brains and their preferences can have upon both individuals and the teams they're part of.

Reb Robb, Campaigns and Admin Assistant at Campaign for Learning, part of the NCFE group, is neurodivergent and attended the session curious about what they could learn.

Reb said: "Becca is a great speaker and her presentation was very informative. It really highlighted some of the simple yet impactful changes that organisations can make to support people to become the best they can be.

"I particularly liked the activity when we looked at colleague work patterns and behaviours, because it highlighted some of the assumptions, we make without knowing the full story.

Allotment & Community Garden

The Quorum Allotment and community garden has exceeded all our expectations in its two years onsite. Year one was a big experiment, and it paid off!

A sunny spot with great soil, we found we had more wins than we did losses (though, to tell the truth, we learned more from our mistakes in the long run!) and as well as being a great supply of fresh home-grown food, we grew something even more exciting – a network of green enthusiasts and a fantastic community asset for the park.

The plot is made up of no dig beds, raised planters and a cut flower garden. We've successfully harvested peas, beans, carrots, beetroot and salad leaves. Our pumpkin patch thrived and the annual harvest is rounded off with a crop of delicious sweetcorn.

We're nature friendly with a pest's welcome policy and we attract pollinators with our cut flowers and companion plants, not to mention a wild flower meadow, pond and stumpery

Volunteers are welcome to give as much or little time as they can afford, budding enthusiasts can pick up skills at our workshops and the addition of our new polytunnel means we're able to work year round. We're avid seed collectors so we're always happy to share the magic.

You don't need to be in possession of green fingers to get something from the space, we've recently installed two reflection benches sat looking out to our rewilded space.

Foster a seedling, get our seedlings going by getting a plant plot ready on your windowsill.

You'll get first dibs on it's produce too!
